O'ZBEKISTON TARAQQIYOTIDA MADANIY MEROS TURIZMINING ROLINI O'RGANISH

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Annotatsiya. - Tourists and visitors are prohibited from smuggling illegal drugs, weapons, and other banned items into the host country during their travels;
- There must be a commitment to uphold gender equality in tourism, ensuring the rights of local populations, particularly vulnerable groups such as children, the elderly, and individuals with disabilities;

- Forms of tourism that facilitate religious, health, cultural, educational, and linguistic exchanges should be actively promoted;
- There is a necessity to integrate scientific insights into educational programs that highlight the value of tourism exchange, along with its economic, social, cultural, and political implications;
- Efforts should be made to enhance the positive effects of tourist influx during holidays and school breaks on the tourism sector and the local economy;
- There is a pressing need to elevate and improve the status of natural tourism and ecotourism, ensuring that these practices honor both the natural heritage and the local communities (Djumaev, 2015).

The research process used analysis and synthesis, induction and deduction, systematic, comparative and factor analysis, scientific abstraction, sociological survey and other methods.
